\$180,113.50 and Climbing

As of June 10, 2006, Rotarians in District 5730 have given \$180,113.50 to THE ROTARY FOUNDATION Annual Program Fund. In addition \$44,797.00 in Restricted Giving has been made our Rotarians. This represents an increase in giving of 80.5% to the Annual Program Funds and 33.6% in Restricted Giving.

Foundation Chairman Jim Cole, knows of over \$10,000 in Annual and \$16,000 in Restricted giving that has not been booked by The Rotary Foundation. Thanks to District 5730 Rotarians, we will have an exceptional year for our Foundation.
